

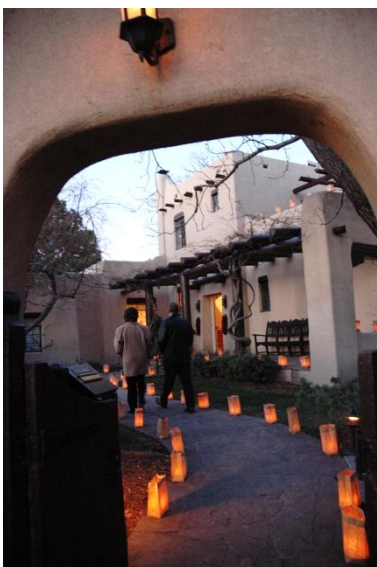
POSITION AVAILABLE: Research Assistant Professor/Project Director

The University of New Mexico College of Education invites applications for a Research Assistant Professor/Project Director. The position will begin July 2017. This position will support a 2.5 million dollar grant from the National Science Foundation which has been recently awarded to UNM: titled: Growth in Math, Language and Cognition in Children with Math Difficulties what are English Language Learners: Bridging the Achievement Gap (also titled: Math problem solving and working memory growth in English Language Learners with Math Disabilities). This grant reflects a 4 year research program focused on identifying areas of cognition, language and instruction that will help bridge the achievement gap in math problem solving and cognitive growth in English language learners who suffer from math difficulties. The Project Director will serve an essential role in successfully meeting the research goals of the grant.

Minimum Qualifications: 1) PhD in educational psychology, special education, school psychology, bilingual education or a related field; at least one year previous testing experience within the public or private schools; and at least one year experience directing research and/or school related projects.

Preferred Qualifications: The ideal candidate would have the following: Ability to speak and write in Spanish; Evidence of competence in testing elementary school children with special needs; at least one year working with bilingual children; Evidence of competence in working with faculty in both higher education and public school context; at least one year experience conducting research and/or managing large federally funded project; Evidence of competence in conducting workshops and/or presenting research at professional conferences; evidence of ability to collaborate and interact with colleagues and students in a collegial manner; a demonstrated commitment to diversity, equity, inclusion, and student success, as well as working with broadly diverse communities

Responsibilities: The Project Director will oversee all aspects of the grant and related activities. Working independently, but in consultation with the PI, they will establish working relationships, negotiate and implement agreements with local public schools and oversee the assessment and evaluation of elementary school children who have potential risks in areas related to math and related achievement difficulties.

**A complete application packet will include:**

1. Letter of intent including a statement of qualifications in relation to the **Minimum** and **Preferred** qualifications;
2. A complete and up-to-date curriculum vitae;
3. The names, addresses, telephone numbers, and e-mail addresses of three to five professional references.
4. Transcripts of **ALL** graduate coursework (readable, unofficial copies will be accepted).
